

MASSACHUSETTS FBLA OUTSTANDING LOCAL ADVISER AWARD

The Outstanding Local Adviser Award honors FBLA local chapter advisers who have made outstanding contributions to the association at the local, state, or national levels.

ELIGIBILITY

All active local advisers are eligible. Advisers may be nominated for this award any year they advise an active FBLA chapter.

REGULATIONS

Any current or retired adviser, local administrator, state officer, chapter member, parent, or school colleague can nominate a current FBLA adviser for this award.

The individual selected as the winner will be recognized with a certificate at the State Leadership Conference. Additionally, they will have the opportunity for national recognition by representing Massachusetts as the state's Outstanding Local Adviser. If the adviser attends the National Leadership Conference (at their own expense), they will be recognized with a certificate and gift at the conference.

PROCEDURES

A nomination form is required. Each nomination form must be accompanied by a letter of recommendation from the person submitting the nomination.

Letters of recommendation should address, to the extent possible, the following:

- Years of participation in FBLA-PBL activities
- Local chapter activities and involvement
- Extent of participation in conferences sponsored by the state chapter and the national association
- Offices, chairmanships, and committee memberships held within the association
- Participation in other professional business organizations
- Involvement in local business community

JUDGING

The State Chairperson will determine the winner based on the submitted information.
